Continuing extra-curricular clubs	We have continued to offer a variety of after school clubs to the children due to their popularity. These include dance, archery, football, multi skills and cricket (chance to shine). P.E. Coach	We have had a P.E. coach to help develop consistency in P.E across school. We have had great success with this and paid for children to attend competitions. Equipment	P.E. cupboards had previously been re-stocked. New equipment bought for golf and boccia.
