Continuing extra-curricular clubs	We have continued to offer a variety of after school clubs to the children due to their popularity. These include table tennis, fencing, football, multi skills and cricket (chance to shine). Table Tennis Coaching and equipment	As table tennis is such a popular sport at Crossley Hall, we have continued to offer Coaching to all of KS1 and 2. This is during curriculum time as part of CPD for staff, lunchtimes and after school. We have had great success with this and paid for children to attend Nationwide competitions. Staff CPD	We have had specialist coaches in to support in the delivery of specific sports. This is related to the competitions and the specific skills the children need to develop. The document is easy to use and focuses on the core skills need in physical development to use in all sports.
Equipment	Re-stocked the PE cupboard with a large variety of equipment. As well as creating a stock for the Early Years building.	Money spent on purchasing equipment- £3,310	Teachers have resources to teach a breadth of PE areas and also to differentiate. The children are using high quality equipment and the early years children have equipment which is relevant to their age.
